

“After Life, After Death: What Happens When We Die?” was posted on YouTube by Seventh-day Adventist Church on 8/21/20. Chris Holland is the speaker.

Chris, I have a few questions for you.

1. A number of times you mention “the Bible” as if there is only one Bible and yet you use two different bibles. Can you explain that?
2. With one exception, which we’ll get to later, all the verses you put up for us to read are from the New King James Version (NKJV). Is that your “the Bible?” Is it infallible without any error at all?

Around 8:31 you quote Genesis 2:7 from the NKJV.

“And the LORD God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living being.” Genesis 2:7 from the NKJV

You fairly promptly abandon the NKJV for the King James Version (KJV) because you want the verse to say “soul” instead of “living being.” That continues later in the presentation when you mention this verse in passing. Here it is from the KJV.

“And the LORD God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul.” Genesis 2:7 from the KJV

If the verse should say “soul” why not just use the Bible that is right to begin with? Both bibles say exactly the same thing except for “soul” versus “being.”

3. Around 12:48 you say that the word “soul” occurs “over fifteen hundred times” in the Bible. What “the Bible” are you speaking of? In the KJV “soul” occurs only 458 times. If you wish to add “souls” and “soul’s” to that it comes to 537. In the NKJV those words occur only about 380 times. Please tell us what “the Bible” has those words “over fifteen hundred times.”

4. I have a question about 1 Thessalonians 4:16 which you quote around 16:23 from your favorite “the Bible.”

“For the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of an archangel, and with the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first.”
1 Thessalonians 4:16 from the NKJV.

“For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first:”
1 Thessalonians 4:16 from the KJV.

Notice that the KJV, which isn't your favorite Bible, says "the archangel" which means there is only one archangel. Your favorite "the Bible" says, "an archangel." Do you know the names of the other archangels?

5. Around 21:06 comes the only time where you put up a verse from the KJV for all to read. Why? Is there something wrong with you favorite "the Bible?"

"All the while my breath is in me, and the spirit of God is in my nostrils;" Job 27:3 from the KJV.

"As long as my breath is in me, And the breath of God in my nostrils." Job 27:3 from the NKJV.

Never mind. I figured it out. You can't prove that breath means the same thing as spirit from the NKJV and that would make later exposition of Scripture difficult. Just think, if you had used the real English Protestant Bible all the way through your discussion, you would have had no difficulty with any of the verses.

6. Around 23:26 you used your favorite "the Bible" again.

"His spirit departs, he returns to his earth; In that very day his plans perish." Pslams 146:4 from the NKJV.

"His breath goeth forth, he returneth to his earth; in that very day his thoughts perish." Pslams 146:4 from the KJV.

This is a verse you couldn't have used from your "the Bible" if you hadn't used Job 27:3 from the KJV to prove that "spirit" and "breath" can mean the same thing. You quote that entire verse from the NKJV but yet you say, "You see, when a person dies, they are sleeping. Their thoughts perish." Yes, you said that and the bible you quoted doesn't say that. You quote from the NKJV and yet you say "their thoughts perish" just like the KJV says. The reading from the NKJV means earthly plans perish and doesn't mean the thoughts perish.
