

This review was posted on the YouTube video, "Adventist Oakwood University Babylonian WINE.Pope Francis Prayer For The Dead WE DON'T DIE SOULphone" published 1/2/20 by Amazing Word Ministries with Emmanuel Nougaisse speaking.

Emmanuel uses several interesting verses from the King James Version (KJV) regarding the state of the dead. Unlike many Seventh-day Adventist ministers including prominent evangelists, he doesn't use the New King James Version (NKJV) so gets into no trouble. You will also notice when those ministers who generally use the NKJV or (worse) come to a verse in their bible of choice that doesn't fit well with the point they're trying to make, guess where they go? To the KJV.

Early in this presentation, Emmanuel uses some verses from the Protestant King James Bible (i.e., the real Bible) that would have gotten him into trouble if he had been using the NKJV.

Genesis 2:7 from the NKJV - "And the LORD God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living being."

Genesis 2:7 from the KJV - "And the LORD God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul."

Seventh-day Adventist ministers like the fact the KJB says "living soul" so they use that Bible. They can't use the NKJV because it says "living being" thus eliminating the connection with the word "soul."

Ecclesiastes 12:7 was used from the KJV.

Ecclesiastes 12:7 KJV - "Then shall the dust return to the earth as it was: and the spirit shall return unto God who gave it."

You could take this to mean that the body returns to dust and the conscious spirit left and returned to God. For this reason you need another verse to show that "spirit" and "breath" mean the same thing. To get a verse showing that, you have to go to the KJV.

Job 27:3 from the KJV "All the while my breath is in me, and the spirit of God is in my nostrils;"

Job 27:3 NKJV - "As long as my breath is in me, And the breath of God in my nostrils,"

The word "spirit" doesn't occur in this verse in the NKJV so it can't be used to show "spirit" and "breath" mean the same thing. But wait, aren't there more verses? Sure. Let's try another one.

Job 34:14 from the KJV - "If he set his heart upon man, if he gather unto himself his spirit and his breath;"

Job 34:14 from the NKJV - "If He should set His heart on it, If He should gather to Himself His Spirit and His breath,"

In the KJV the verse is talking about "man." See all the capitalized pronouns in the NKJV? The whole NKJV verse is talking about God so proves nothing about man.

There are a couple more verses that contain the words "spirit" and "breath" but they aren't too helpful. They are Job 33:4 and Isaiah 43:5.
